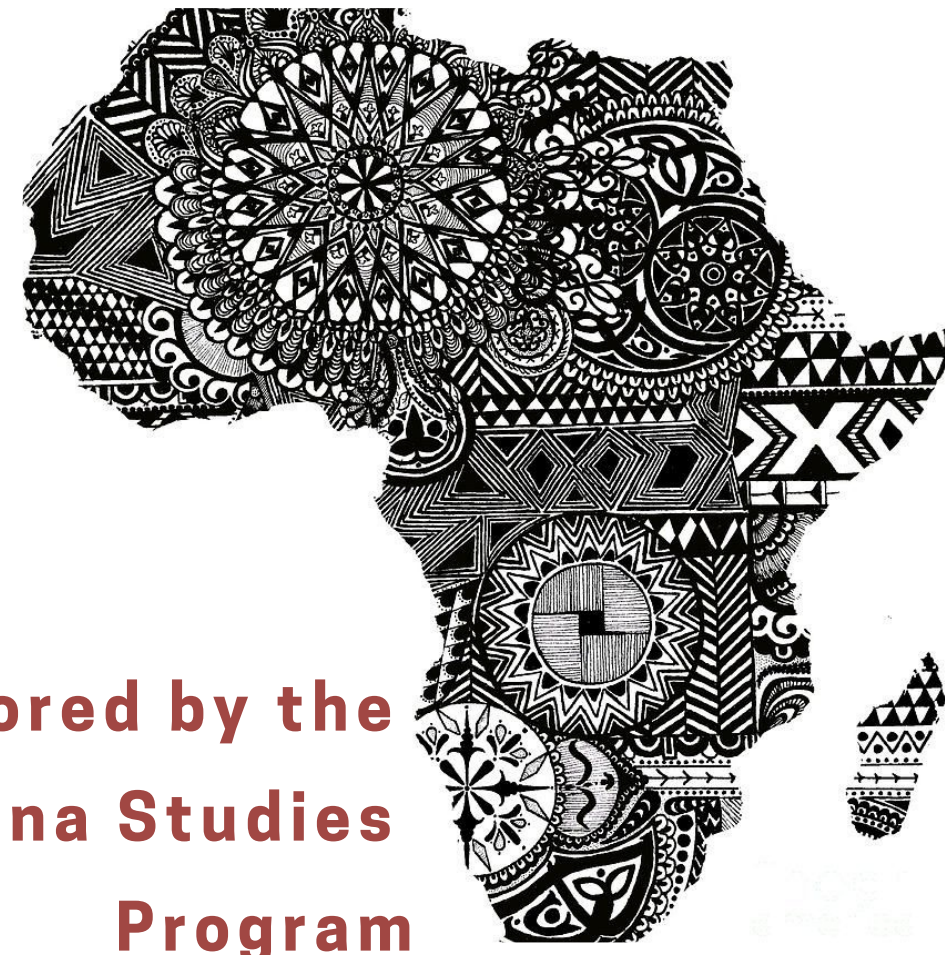

Why Attend

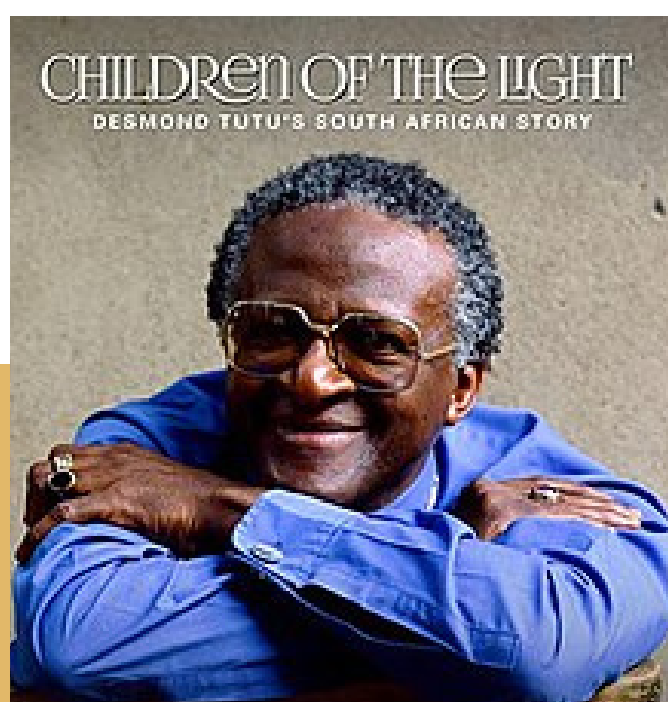

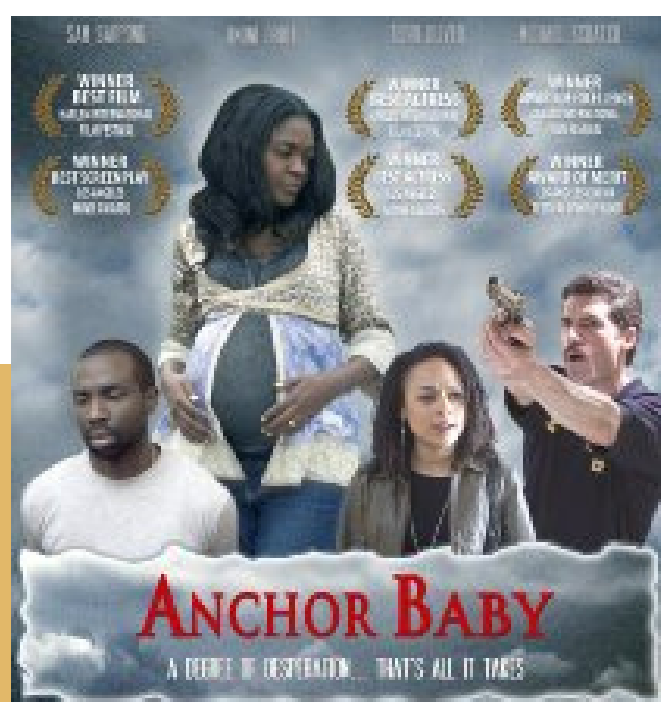
What to Expect
