



DIRECTOR'S NOTES

When we first discussed producing A Midsummer Night's Dream last year, we began a series of artistic discussions leading us to thoughts on the layered nature of dreams in Shakespeare's text. What do our dreams reveal about ourselves? When a waking dream is patently real, is the reality we wake up to actually the dream and the "dream" a continued reality? Our discussions lasted until the beginning of the semester when Professor Marian Zielinski offered an incredible design presentation that enlivened the entire artistic staff with its layers of possibility and brilliant use of the challenging Back Door Theatre space.

The artistic team set Athens in a late Neoclassical era for the period's love of order, symmetry, and reason. Hermia is at the mercy of a patriarchal, rigid system of laws that has managed to subdue even the Queen of the Amazons by way of force. Escape from her situation requires escape from order, and Lysander's idea to travel through the woods outside the bounds of Athenian law provides the only alternative. Like the Romantics, they rebel against the rigid order of the day.

The forest is one of the Romantics, a place of mystery, adventure, and passion. A mortal feels small and powerless in comparison to their ordered life in Athens. The tairy kingdom converges with the escaping lovers to create a waking, multilayered dream. Disorder abounds with mortal and fairy alike, and the use of magic as a solution further confounds even the power of true love. It is the journey through these layers of knotted dreams, however, that eventually brings new order to worlds of the Fairy Kingdom and Athens.

A production requires many hours of rehearsal, physical labor, knowledge of engineering and drafting, and artistry in the scene shop, costume shop, and on the lighting crew. The students and professionals who labored so steadfastly on this project have my eternal gratitude. And to our tireless artistic staff, which does the work of a department twice its size elsewhere, thank you for being the most consummately talented group of artists with whom I have ever had the privilege to collaborate.


