

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I remembered the warning of the editor of a paper I once worked for - "Always avoid first reactions; they might be honest."

Certainly, the above was good advice in Socialist Poland in 1981, after the military seized control of the government and imposed martial law in reaction to the Solidarity movement. Under a totalitarian regime that imprisoned thousands and banned the work of teachers and members of the media if they failed "verification" and showed sympathy with the Solidarity movement...one's neighbor was their spy. Any question, no matter how mundane (i.e. "do you like eggs for breakfast") could be answered incorrectly, or in a way that insinuated disapproval of the Socialist state, and result in imprisonment. It is against this backdrop that Glowacki sets Cinders, and the reform school itself serves as a metaphor for the surrealistic, absurd reality Poles were forced to endure. "I see", means "I don't see", and "what do you think" is either a trap, or a desperate attempt to learn the official opinion one is expected to express. The Polish nation endured this psychological stress and it's effect on their interactions until 1983. when Martial Law was lifted, but the cycle of censorship and punishment remained.
