DIRECTOR'S NOTES

"African American playwrights, in depicting a character on stage, brought with them the historical and racial baggage that an audience might bring, regardless of whether the audience is black or white or any other color... Therefore part of the challenge of the writer is somehow to reveal the humanity, the truth, the energy, and the complexity that emerges from a stereotype." (Margaret Wilkerson, 1997)

One of the reasons I love *The Colored Museum* is because George C. Wolfe calls on us all to acknowledge our history – whatever it may be! Whoever we are! He urges us – through the play - not to allow the past to hold us back, keep us down, or dictate how we will live. We must be resolute enough to learn from our history, and then forge our own new paths toward a fulfilling life. There are no apologies, no excuses. Wolfe exposes the truth for what it is, and then lets the audience decide "what to do with it." He uses the very elements listed in Wilkerson's quote to color his characters:

HUMANITY: He educates the audience about the many stereotypes embedded within America's consciousness and sub-consciousness. He challenges us to learn from these stereotypes, and then to let them go. **TRUTH**: He does not create an easy way out for his characters, but challenges them to confront their demons, face their reality and accept the truth for what it is

ENERGY: He charges them to plunge head first through their tribulations with conviction, and to tackle their problems with all the force and spirit they can muster.

COMPLEXITY: And, he also compels them (and us) - to be accountable for their actions, as well as their issues.

I hope you will enjoy this play for its honesty, and ultimately, appreciate what it teaches.
