Director's Notes

What first fascinated us on the first reading of Steven Dietz's Fiction was the amazing quality of the dialogue. It has always been a feature of a Dietz work, but the dialogue here drew us into the characters, into the structure of the journey, and compelled us to continue until we had read every word. We knew we had to produce the work, not only for our program, but also for the greater community of writers at Mercer. Even the notion that a personal journal cannot be an example of absolute fact brings the idea of writing's relationship with truth to question. We often search for truth through our writing and our art. But can we ever arrive there? Dietz believes that "when you write about an incident, just the act of writing involves some level of invention. Even if you try to tell the truth, you're still concerned with looking good on paper, so that changes the nature of truth, and turns it into a type of fiction." And so, we present Michael, Linda, and Abby engaged in a search for truth and meaning among the piles of carefully chosen words on a page. Enjoy the search.
