When Professor Zielinski, Dr. Malone and I first decided to revive the Mercer Musical, we began looking for a piece that offered a variety of roles for our performers, a design challenge for our technicians, and a solid story backed by terrific music. *Fiddler on the Roof* seemed perfect and it has not disappointed!

The characters and music of Anatevka have grown in our hearts with each day of rehearsal. Tevye and the people of Anatevka endure the realities of poverty and the very real danger of systematic ethnic violence through the strength of their traditions. The message of the importance of family and the strength of community during trying times could not be more appropriate for our own community as we weather financial and personal challenges brought on by forces which we do not control.

As a producing director, I must say that the successful conclusion of this effort would in no way be possible without their dedication, selflessness, sacrifice, talent, and countless hours of labor that far exceed what anyone could justifiably ask of them. Their devotion to this art, our students, our community, and their craft is of the highest caliber.

Also, we thank you! Not only for your support by attending the performance but also those who lent their understanding to their children, their spouses, their loved ones who include students of Mercer, professors, and members of the community as they spent many nights in rehearsal and days building the village of Anatevka. Truly, the community of our production extends past the stage and into the house. Welcome to the ensemble.

THE PLACE: ANATEVKA, A SMALL VILLAGE IN RUSSIA THE TIME: 1905, ON THE EVE OF THE RUSSIAN REVOLUTIONARY PERIOD

Fiddler on the Roof, based on the short story "Tevye and His Daughters" by Sholom Aleichem, was one of the first musicals to defy Broadway's established rules of commercial success. It dealt with serious issues such as persecution, poverty, and the struggle to hold on to one's beliefs in the midst of a hostile and chaotic environment. Criticized at first for its "limited appeal," *Fiddler on the Roof* struck such a universal chord in audiences that it became, for a time, the longest running production in the history of Broadway.
