Director's Notes

Hedda Gabler was born into a legacy of aristocracy. Though she lived a pampered life, Hedda's time as a single girl ran out and she married George Tesman, a man she clearly no longer loves - if, indeed, she ever did. With her father, The General, gone, she is left with her wardrobe, a piano, her father's dueling pistols, and nothing else. Marriage is her only choice in the strict patriarchal world she inhabits. Now Hedda is driven to diabolical ends trying to discover purpose in her life as she increasingly finds the world closing in on her.

Ibsen writes one of the earliest challenges to modern patriarchy, a brazen precursor to feminism and gender equality. Recession and economic prosperity sit side by side in Hedda's world, antiquated by patriarchal society and made vibrant by Hedda's lust for life. Cornered in a life she can no longer control, she makes an extreme decision unthinkable by traditional Victorian values.
