Hot N Throbbing tells the story of a dysfunctional family fighting its way to destruction. Charlene, who writes women's crotica to support her 16-year-old daughter and 14-year-old son, is both attracted to and repelled by her exhusband Clyde, who can't seem to leave her alone despite a restraining order. The play also offers two other voices: a woman whose dialogue represents Charlene's inner thoughts and a man who represents a variety of characters, including the male part of Charlene and the fears that Clyde has instilled in her.

But the play's purpose is more than what appears on the surface. In reality, the script delives into the connections between sex, power and domestic abuse. As the director of a recent production in Washington, DC comments, "This is a dangerous and exciting play that is both screamingly funny and deeply devastating."

Even the title evokes comments. The DC director stated, "I think that the title is a comment on the relationship between sex and violence and how we are very mixed up about those two topics in our scoiety. We love to be titiliated, but we chastise those who titiliate us. We have one of the biggest, if not THE biggest, sex industries in the world, and the highest level of violence. I think that Paula Vogel wants us to go through that twist, to hear the title and get kind of excited, giggly, and then to realize that it is a play about domestic violence."


