

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

With this production of *The Merchant of Venice*, we are attempting to tell the comic love story that makes it a comedy without masking the spiritual and moral warts that blemish the heroes. We're also choosing to tell Shylock's story without watering down either his harshness or his humanity. Shylock, through cruel twists of fate, blind rage, and the selective interpretation of the law, ends a broken man who has lost everything — his profession, money, faith, and family. It is not quite classic tragedy because he doesn't wind up dead, but in terms of human loss, this is a deeply troubling story that deals with issues we would far rather brush under the table.

Surrounding this is the story of three sets of lovers, each having their own moral flaws. The comic language is genius, and seeing a character that made you laugh moments ago turn and engage in socially condoned bigotry is jarring for our modern sensibilities. Shakespeare's play offers us neither a simple answer, nor a satisfying conclusion. But it does 'hold the mirror up to nature' and shows us our own selves in a rather unflattering light. Theatre has always provided a lens through which we can explore our place in a larger world, and examine our foibles, biases, and blind spots. It does provoke the conversation about who we really are. When will we learn "the quality of mercy is not strained?"
