Director's Notes

The original production of Anton Chekhov's The Seagull was an unmitigated disaster. Chekhov wrote in one of his letters "I didn't do the casting. No new sets were made. There had been only two rehearsals and the actors kept forgetting their lines. The result was general panic and total depression". He insisted it was a comedy, but few seemed to understand the irony he was presenting. In 1898, the famous director and acting teacher, Constantin Stanislavski, took on the play with a different work ethic. Great attention to realism in the costuming, lighting and sets took priority. Stanislavski's actors were carefully rehearsed and a strong ensemble created such a realistic offering (uncommon at the time) that the play became an instant triumph. Anatoly Smeliansky observed that the play "revitalized the art of acting, made a cult of the pause, the subtext and constant interaction of the characters." The event was so important to the development of the Moscow Art Theatre that a seagull graces the main curtain to this day. And for us, the play still speaks to the struggles of love, meaning, and finding truth in your art.
