DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature, Italian playwright Luigi Pirandello wrote his most famous play Six Characters in Search of an Author in 1921. The work is often re-translated and updated as it marks a turning point from a more ceremonial and communal feeling of the theatre to matters more personal in nature.

Pirandello's construct, the Characters, never fully realized and abandoned by their original author, wander the night in search of someone to finish their drama. Six of these characters are trapped in a static moment of their torrid drama. When they encounter a professional company of actors rehearsing a play, two worlds converge: People (the theatre company and the audience) and Characters.

Characters remain what they are, unchanging. They appear to have no reality beyond the line of their narrative. The People are like us: changing over time, in and out of love, forgetting and remembering. We are not the same one moment to the next, much less the same person we were ten years ago.

The Characters, once realized in a drama, will remain unchanged as immortal works of art. The People live in flashing moments that are here and gone, and may not even be remembered. Thus the most far-reaching questions of Pirandello's work—What is reality and which is more solid, that which changes or that which is unchangeable?
