Synopsis

The plot starts when King Alonso of Naples and his entourage sail home for Italy after attending his daughter's wedding in Tunis, Africa. They encounter a violent storm, or Tempest. Everyone jumps overboard and is washed ashore on a strange island inhabited by the magician Prospero who has deliberately conjured up the storm. Prospero and Miranda live in a cave on the island, which is also inhabited by Ariel, a sprite who carries out the bidding of Prospero, and the half human Caliban. Those washed ashore include Prospero's brother who supplanted him as Duke of Milan, accompanied by the King of Naples, complicit in the treachery. Prospero uses his magic and Ariel's supernatural talents to manipulate the plotters and bring them to him to decide their fate.
