How to Use this Four-Year Plan

Choosing a major is an important decision. Completing that course of study in a timely manner while maximizing its benefits to your professional development is equally important and calls for careful planning and implementation.

This Four-Year Plan is designed to help students create a roadmap for their course requirements in both General Education (listed in orange on the Four-Year Plan) and the English major (listed in purple).

The Four-Year Plan also offers suggestions on how (and when) to explore opportunities in the department that will enhance your learning experience and strengthen your professional development.

These opportunities include:

- Academic and Professional Pathways (listed on the Four-Year Plan in green)
- Scholarship and Fellowship Opportunities (listed in red)
- Experiential Learning, Service Learning, and other Credentialing Opportunities (listed in blue)
- Undergraduate Research and Honors in English (listed in teal)

English Major Requirements (30-33 semester credit hours minimum)
